## LIVESTOCK SHOWMANSHIP

Entry Fee \$5.00

1. Showmanship classes must be entered in advance on entry forms.
2. Animals must be entered in their respective breeding or market livestock classes to be eligible for use in showmanship classes.
3. All exhibitors will be required to wear the show uniform of the organization they represent.
4. Each exhibitor to show his or her own animal.
5. Each exhibitor to groom or fit his or her own animal. Please refer to Livestock Department rule #9 for complete details.
6. Class winners are expected to compete in the Round Robin Showmanship Contest. See Round Robin section.
7. **The grade of the exhibitor on the day of the show determines showmanship class.**

- 1 FFA Novice -- no experience before a judge with any type of animal. First Place winner may move up to Experienced Class

- 4 4-H Novice - no experience before a judge with any type of animal. First Place winner may move up to respective grade class
- 5 4-H Junior - Grades 6 and under
- 6 4-H Intermediate - Grades 7-8
- 7 4-H Senior - Grade 9 & up

## PEE WEE SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP

Entry Fee \$2.00

1. Contest will take place on Sunday September 20, at 2:00pm
2. **Pre-Entry by August 28, 2009 is recommended but not required. Entry should be made on Livestock Entry Form.**
3. This contest is open to youngsters not old enough to enroll in 4-H or exhibit in the livestock department of the fair.
4. Youngsters entered in a Junior Livestock Department are not eligible to compete in Pee Wee Showmanship.
5. Lambs will be provided and entrants will draw lots to determine which lamb they are to show. Fitting will not be a determining factor, handling and presence before judge are considered most important.
6. 4-H or FFA Uniforms are **not** to be worn. Contestants should be suitably dressed.

## ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP

1. Contestant to have won his/her Showmanship division (excluding Novice 4-H and Novice FFA) in Beef, Dairy, Swine, Sheep, Dairy Goats or Market Goats.
2. If for some reason an exhibitor is unable to participate in Round Robin, they must inform the Livestock Office immediately upon conclusion of their showmanship division.
3. Only first place winners are eligible. If extenuating circumstances arise, the second place winner may be allowed to move to first place and compete. Determining the validity of the extenuating circumstance is at the Livestock Superintendent's discretion.
4. Each contestant to exhibit their own animal in their category, and these animals must have been entered and shown in their respective divisions and be the animal they won their respective showmanship division with.
5. If a showman wins in more than one specie/division they must designate which specie/division they will represent in Round Robin and the second place winner of the specie/division they are not representing will be given the opportunity to represent that specie/division.
6. Each contestant to exhibit all other species represented.
7. In the event of a tie score between two or more contestants, the tie will be broken in this order:
  - A. The contestant with the highest score on the specie that qualified him/her for Round Robin.
  - B. The exhibitor with the most consistent set of scores.
8. Contestants will be scored on a possible of ten points per specie.
9. Each 4-H and FFA contestant scoring the highest combined score for Beef, Sheep and Swine to receive the Best FFA and Best 4-H Livestock Showman award.
